

# A Touch of Love

There is an age-old tradition where people predict their children’s future by the objects they’ll grab – swords indicate physical prowess; a seal reveals a career as an official; jewels predict a future of wealth. Nowadays, there is a more scientific way to predict our future, by our fingerprints.

## Future is in Your Hands

“Formed during the foetus’ 13 to 26 weeks of development, fingerprints already planted the seeds to the child’s potential.” said fingerprint analyst Ellen Mok, founder of MIQI. Though she adds that humans are 35% by inborn and 75% by nurture, fingerprints on our fingers are linked to the 10 regions of the brains which could foresee children’s future development; thumbs left and right reveal social skills and self discipline, respectively; indexes represent spatial conception and logic; middle fingers indicate muscle memory and creativity; ring fingers show musical inclinations and language; while pinkies tell aesthetics and attention to detail.



## Which animal is your personality most alike?

To better convey her message, Ellen categorises 14 kinds of fingerprints into seven animals such as ox, peacock, monkey, bat, cat, lion and dog to represent each of these shapes and traits. For example, the ox is hardworking and practical; yet the monkey is spritely and the lion has superb leadership skills. These seven animals were meticulously selected to best represent their corresponding personalities.





*There’s no “good” or “bad”*

Though we can’t change our genes, fingerprint analysis helps individuals – especially children – to nurture their potential through ways to which they best respond. For example: a child who has a follower-type personality can be helped with encouragement and companionship. “There is no good or bad personalities, just how to develop and reflect the dominant of these personalities.” Ellen added.



*Know your beloved*

Aside from hosting workshops and classes, Ellen has analysed the fingerprints of a number of celebrity families, including the modelling couple, Jocelyn Luko and Anthony Sandstrom. The results not only allowed them to gain a better understanding of themselves (Luko is an expressive and righteous peacock on the outside and a perfectionist Lion on the inside while Sandstorm is a playful monkey and a loyal dog) but also a better knowledge of one another so to build a healthier, flourishing relationship.
